Activities will be picked during the scheduling process with your coordinator. Premium activities may be offered (if availability allows) with an additional charge added to the final cost.

Guarantee

Guaranteed minimum cabin rental: 8 Trailhead bunkhouses

Maximum cabin rental: 10 Trailhead bunkhouses

On or before **June 11, 2026**, you agree to inform Wolf Mountain of a more accurate anticipated count. You will pay any remaining balance due upon arrival.

Wolf Mountain has reserved the Trailhead facility for your Youth Retreat.

If Cancellation is Necessary

You understand that cancellation or reduction of this contract is possible only if Wolf Mountain Camps can arrange a replacement group to generate comparable income. If a replacement group is arranged, all but \$100 of the deposit monies will be refunded. If no arrangement is possible, you understand that you are obligated to meet the full minimum income guarantee listed in the contract.

Finances

You agree to pay \$225 per cabin for a minimum income guarantee of \$1,800.

A deposit of \$180 is required (10% of the minimum income guarantee but not less than \$100 or more than \$750). This deposit will be applied to your final bill. If your custom camp falls below the minimum number for part or all of the duration, you will meet your entire financial obligation to Wolf Mountain for the full amount of the minimum income guarantee. **An additional 5% fee will be charged if payment is not submitted upon arrival during camper registration. Payment may be made by check or credit card. (Paying with a credit card will add 3% to your total cost if the total balance of your event is \$2,500 or more.)**

You understand that in extreme situations Wolf Mountain may adjust the rates stated on this contract up to 30 days prior to the event. Written notification will be made to the group coordinator or contact person noted above.

Registration

Wolf Mountain will provide the group coordinator or contact person with a packet with guidelines and requirements that are part of this agreement. To comply with state law, the group coordinator or contact person must provide a correctly completed medical consent and permission form for children and youth (under 18) attending. Wolf Mountain will provide these forms.

The group coordinator or contact person is required to provide the necessary figures to enable Wolf Mountain to complete an invoice for the event before arrival and to pay any remaining balance due upon arrival.

Facility Care

Crockett Christian Fellowship is requested to assist, wherever reasonable, in placing in order all the facilities it has occupied. The leaders of Crockett Christian Fellowship are expected to maintain order at all times and prevent damage to Wolf Mountain property. It is understood that Wolf Mountain will charge the group for any damages incurred by them.

Schedules

A group may determine its own daily schedule within the following guidelines:

1. Normal mealtimes at Wolf Mountain are 8:00 a.m. breakfast, 12:30 p.m. lunch, and 6:00 p.m. dinner. Set times for meals should not vary more than 30 minutes (+ or -).
2. Time of first meal after arrival may be set to accommodate your expected arrival time.
3. All custom camps must have a time scheduled for spiritual challenge, enrichment, and decision.

Governing Guidelines

1. Wolf Mountain requires all day guests, full-time campers, and part-time campers to register and pay for time on camp property. The signer accepts the responsibility of communicating this, especially to any day guests.
2. Crockett Christian Fellowship agrees to respect the beliefs and standards of Wolf Mountain and do nothing by word or act, or allow any member or speaker to do likewise, that will in any way detract from or be contradictory to those beliefs and standards.
3. Crockett Christian Fellowship agrees to abide by the guidelines described in this contract, those in the custom camp packet provided, and those posted on the grounds. The signer accepts the responsibility of communicating these guidelines to the leadership and participants of the custom camp and will follow through to ensure compliance.
4. It is understood that this contract is not binding until a copy bears signatures of both parties involved.
5. If Crockett Christian Fellowship is underwritten by no formal organization or fellowship, the undersigned agrees to be held individually responsible for the financial obligation shown above.
6. **Crockett Christian Fellowship agrees to sign and return this contract with the indicated deposit on or before February 27, 2026, or it is understood that Wolf Mountain is free to negotiate with another group for the time shown above.**
7. No group is guaranteed exclusive use of Wolf Mountain unless it is specifically stated above.

Guest Speaker

The housing, food, and honorarium of a group's guest speaker are the responsibility of the guest group. If the group's guest speaker brings children who will not be participating in their program, the group is responsible for the full-time supervision of those children.

You will be doing your own speaking and music according to our records.

Camp Environment

Please do your best to keep Wolf Mountain clean. It is stated elsewhere, but for emphasis...No smoking, no alcoholic beverages, no dancing, no rock music, and no pets.

Supervision

Children and youth camps need a counselor to camper minimum ratio of 1:7. The counselors are responsible for the constant supervision of their campers while at Wolf Mountain. A pre-camp volunteer sponsors' meeting is required upon arrival. All minors must be supervised at all times. We do not allow minors to be in cabins overnight without an adult supervisor of the same gender. Cabin occupancy for children and youth camps is based on 7-10 people per cabin.

Sale of Books and Other Items

Crockett Christian Fellowship agrees not to engage in any commercial sale of books, apparel, supplies, or any kind of materials without advanced agreement with Wolf Mountain. A bookstore is on the premises to take care of book and souvenir needs.

Acceptance

If all arrangements meet your approval, please sign the contract and the position statement and return it to Wolf Mountain no later than February 27, 2026, with your deposit. After that date, if not signed by both parties, this agreement will be subject to release. Please retain a copy for your records.

We at Wolf Mountain look forward to serving you and your group and hope to make your retreat a memorable one.

We will send you a packet with camper information, cabin assignment sheets, and other pertinent information approximately six weeks prior to your event.



POSITION STATEMENT

Wolf Mountain is a camp to be used by groups that would characterize themselves as fundamental, Bible-believing churches/schools. During our sponsored camps, few restrictions are placed on who can attend; however, churches/schools who wish to set up a custom camp will be asked to sign the following position statement.

Crockett Christian Fellowship does not associate with, fellowship with, or join together with unbelievers for religious or spiritual endeavors. This includes those who do not believe in the veracity of Scriptures as the only source of absolute truth or do not believe that salvation is by grace through faith in Jesus Christ alone, apart from any additional works or second acts of grace. Furthermore, we do not subscribe to any belief that the revelation of God is incomplete or that visions, dreams, speaking in tongues, or any additional contemporary inspiration gives new revelation that would add to, amend, or in any way contradict the literal, historical, contextual interpretation of the Scriptures long established as the Canon of the Word of God.

One area of literal interpretation under cultural attack today deals with God's established roles of leadership in the home and church. Crockett Christian Fellowship believes that the Bible teaches that qualifications of a pastor found in 1 Timothy 3 and Titus 1 indicate clearly that the office of pastor of a local church should be filled by a man. We understand that Wolf Mountain recognizes the priesthood of the believer, the autonomy of the local church, and individual soul liberty and accountability to our Lord Jesus Christ. Nevertheless, if necessary in the interest of not being offensive to the conscience of other believers (1 Corinthians 10:23-33), we agree in Christian love (Romans 14) to put others first by limiting our liberty so as not to be a stumblingblock (1 Corinthians 8), and thereby glorify our Lord Jesus Christ (1 Corinthians 10:31). Therefore, we agree to operate within the application guidelines of practice and behavior established by Wolf Mountain while conducting a custom camp retreat at their facility.


While the absolutes of the Scripture and the principles derived from them never change, specific practices may change as churches make new applications in a changing society. We understand that in order to deal with such applications in a way that is non-offensive for some believers Wolf Mountain has adopted some application guidelines of practice and behavior for custom camp groups.

Application Guidelines for Practice and Behavior: It is understood that these guidelines are for members of Crockett Christian Fellowship while at Wolf Mountain and may or may not reflect our church's beliefs or practices when not at Wolf Mountain.

- Wolf Mountain requests that every retreat or camp have at least one gospel or Bible-based message or service each full day that they are on the camp facility.
- Wolf Mountain requests that groups focus on Bible preaching and teaching, testimonies of praise to the Lord, workshops and seminars on biblically related subjects, songs of worship and praise to God above, and prayers; while refraining from any outward manifestations of sign gifts.
- Wolf Mountain requests that participants refrain from smoking, vaping, and use of tobacco or tobacco-like products, drinking alcoholic beverages, or using illegal drugs.
- Wolf Mountain requests that all campers follow the dress guideline regarding modesty and appropriateness outlined in the camper information flyer.
- Wolf Mountain requests that groups conducting their own music use sacred traditional music, Scripture songs, or praise and worship choruses whose lyrics are in agreement with Scripture.
- Wolf Mountain requests that musical instruments used for accompaniment be limited to a piano or an acoustical guitar.
- Wolf Mountain requests that the use of media and videos be consistent with the requests above.
- Baptism and communion are ordinances of the local church and will be practiced at Wolf Mountain only if a specific local church does so under the leadership of the pastor/s of that church.

We agree to operate within the application guidelines of practice and behavior established by Wolf Mountain while conducting a custom camp retreat at their facility.
